## Inside Story Headline

Think about your article and post yourself if the picture supports or enhances the message you're trying to convey. Avoid selecting images that appear to be out of context. Microsoft includes thousands of clip art images from which you can choose, and you can import them into your newsletter. There are also several tools you can use to draw shapes and symbols.
